Hello everyone,

Welcome back to school for our last term of the year. I hope that all our families enjoyed some relaxing family time together and remained healthy throughout the fortnight. There was much excitement as our students arrived back to school yesterday and shared their holiday activities with their peers.

We were excited to welcome everyone back, but especially so to see Miss Johnson after her travels, and also Mrs Page after her long absence. There were many excited students, and staff too.

A reminder that this term it is compulsory, as a part of the DECYP SunSmart Policy, for our students to wear school hats during outdoor time, in the playground, on the farm etc. This is because the UV will be 3 or above every day from the start of September through to the end of April. Sun protection is required whenever the UV is 3 or above. This week is our transition week, but we encourage all parents to organise a school hat for your child ready to be worn as soon as possible. 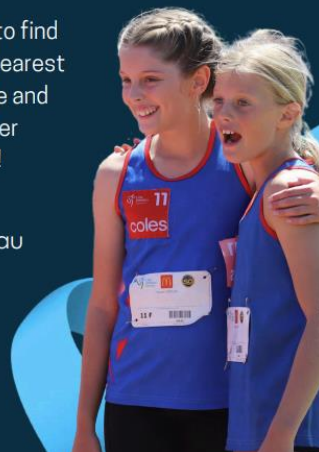
